É atualmente o Frank E. Stinchfield Professor and Chairman, Department of Orthopaedic Surgery, College of Physicians & Surgeons, Columbia University in the City of New York and Director of Service, Orthopaedic Surgery, New York-Presbyterian Hospital, Columbia Campus, New York. Ele foi o escolhido para proferir a clássica "Codman Lecture", que é o momento científico mais importante do 10º ICSES. O atarefado "Louis" respondeu a estas perguntas:

JOC - How important is the ICSES for the international Scientific community?

Bigliani - Every three years the ICSES provides an outstanding forum for the exchange of the latest scientific information concerning shoulder and elbow surgery. There is always the highest quality of basic science and clinical presentations as well as instructional courses and symposia. Furthermore, the meeting provides ample opportunity for personal and informal communication with colleagues and leaders of shoulder and elbow surgery in the world.

JOC - "The subacromial space" is the most expected lecture of the meeting. Any anticipation about the topic?

Bigliani - The subacromial space is an anatomical area that has made the shoulder unique. It has been studied for hundreds of years yet remains a complex area that requires more research and understanding. A variety of scientific technologies have been used to study this area and will be reviewed as well as the contributions from the Columbia Shoulder Service through the years.

JOC - it is a special moment for the shoulder surgeons of Latin America to have the ICSES here in Brazil. You were very much in favor since the very beginning. Why was that?

Bigliani - Over the last 20 years I have had a very warm and lasting relationship with Latin American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons. I have been impressed with their enthusiasm, energy and skill. They have a compelling desire for knowledge concerning the shoulder and elbow and have made significant contributions to our field. Have the ICSES in Latin America will help foster the growth of our subspecialty in this continent.
